Disease	Symptoms in Women	Mother	Fetus/Baby
AIDS	Appetite or weight loss, fatigue, swollen lymph nodes, night sweats, fever or chills, persistent diarrhea or cough	Immune system damage, leading to infections (such as pneumonia) or cancers; death	Immune system damage leading to death in 1-2 years in most infants.
Chlamydia	Genital burning or itching, vaginal discharge, painful or frequent urination, pelvic pain; may be no symptoms.	Pelvic inflammatory disease, ectopic pregnancy	Eye infection, pneumonia
Gonorrhea	Vaginal discharge, minor genital irritation; most women have no symptoms	Pelvic inflammatory disease, infertility, arthritis	Eye infection if left untreated
Genital Herpes	Flu-like symptoms (fever, chills, muscle aches, etc); small, painful, fluid-filled blisters on genitals or buttocks	Recurrent outbreaks	Sever skin infection, nervous system damage, blindness, mental retardation, death
Genital Warts	Possible genital itching, irritation, or bleeding; warts may appear as small, cauliflower-shaped clusters	Warts grow in size and number, cancerous changes	Warts may block vaginal opening
Syphilis	A painless open sore called a chancre; later rash, sluggishness or slight fever	Damage to heart, blood vessels, and nervous system; blindness, insanity, death	Miscarriage, stillbirth, syphilis in liveborn infant.
